## Ring size aid and guide

The pattern and the stripe must be printed in original $100 \%$ size (scale 1:7). To make sure you have printed the document correctly, compare against the control gauge in a document with a rule.

## Measuring stripe to measure your finger

Cut out the measuring stripe along its outer line. Cut a slot at the dotted line and put the stripe's end through the hole you have just made. Put the stripe on your fi nger, tighten and read the size. The stripe must not be too tight or too loose-fi tting to fi nd out the right ring size. Make sure the broader part of the measuring stripe is not standing out but clings to the fi nger. Use the neighbouring fi nger to hold the stripe end. Don't forget that the ring must go through the knuckle in order to put it on the fi nger. It is hence required to measure it just around the knuckle or the fi nger's broadest part.

Circle patterns to measure ring size
If you need to measure the size of a ring you already have, use the circle patterns of various ring sizes. Put the ring onto a pattern so that its internal circumference closely copy the circle at the pattern.
